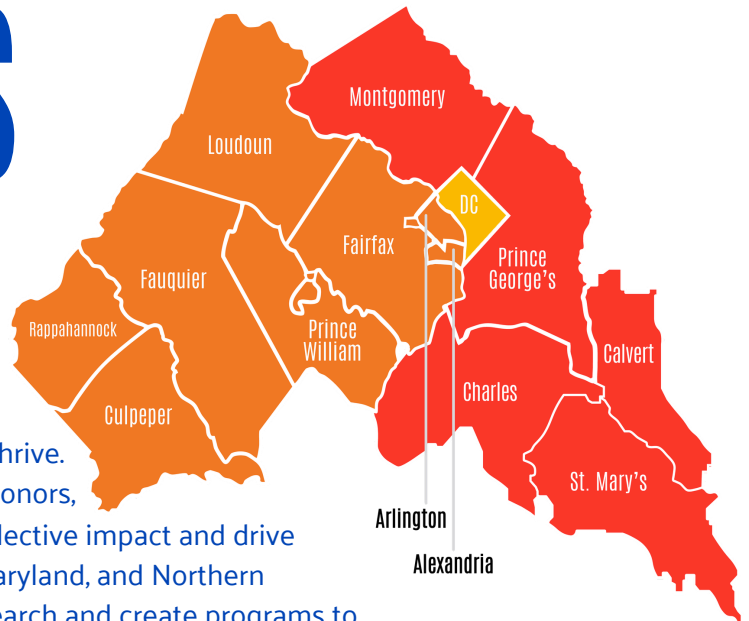

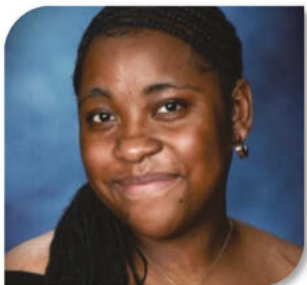

The Impact of Your Investment: Scholar Voices and Aspirations

Your generosity continues to make a lasting difference in the lives of our scholars. Because of your support, students are not only able to pursue higher education—they are empowered to dream boldly, overcome barriers, and create meaningful change within their communities.

For many of our scholars, receiving financial support is life-changing. One student reflected, *“The first scholarship I ever received came from my local NSBE Jr. LEAP Forward Chapter. This current scholarship would allow me to complete my final year without financial strain and honor the sacrifices of my family and community.”*

Another scholar shared the reality of funding their education independently: *“I have saved money from work, past savings, and earned merit scholarships due to my grades. Those things have helped me, but since I am paying for college on my own, scholarship money from any program would put me in a better financial position.”*

These voices remind us that behind every award is not just a student, but a story of perseverance, responsibility, and determination.

Our scholars represent a wide range of passions and academic pursuits, yet they are united by a common desire: to make a difference.

Some are drawn to **service-oriented careers** rooted in compassion and care. One aspiring nurse shared, *“Nursing is not a job where you can simply clock in, sit, put in minimum effort, and clock out. You see people on their worst days. As a nurse, you have to pour your heart and soul into helping people recover. Ever since I was little, it has been my dream to make a difference in the world.”*

Another future healthcare provider, currently preparing for medical school, expressed a commitment not just to treating illness, but to leadership and mentorship: *“I want to use my education, experiences, and personal story to make a lasting impact, especially on those from less fortunate neighborhoods who often face barriers to success.”*

Others are focused on **advocacy and systemic change**. One scholar described a vision grounded in purpose: *“My goals are rooted in wanting a meaningful and sustainable career where I can help people and express creativity. I am considering paths in law or public health policy, where I can advocate for communities and contribute to real, systemic change.”*

Innovation and problem-solving also drive many of our students. Future engineers and technologists are preparing to tackle some of the world’s greatest challenges. One aspiring mechanical engineer shared an interest in *“developing sustainable technologies, including renewable energy systems and cleaner industrial processes, with the goal of reducing environmental impact while improving everyday life.”*

The Impact of Your Investment: Scholar Voices and Aspirations

A computer science student reflected on a lifelong passion for technology, adding, *“My long-term goal is to build accessible educational software that makes learning engaging and available to everyone, regardless of background.”*

Several scholars are already thinking beyond their careers, envisioning **ways to uplift others**. One student highlighted the growing challenges of the digital divide: *“Technology is advancing faster than many older adults can adapt. My goal is to eventually develop a nonprofit organization that provides training and support for the aging population, especially in the communities where I grew up.”*

Dreams also take flight in more literal ways. One scholar pursuing aviation shared a lifelong passion: *“I have been captivated with flying since I was young and plan to pursue a career as a commercial pilot. I am currently working toward my private pilot license, and college will allow me to fully pursue this path.”*

Creative and business-minded ambitions are equally present. One student pursuing brand marketing expressed gratitude by stating, *“Your investment in my education is not just helping me get a degree—it is helping me create a solid foundation for my family and turn my dreams into reality.”*

And for some, the impact is deeply personal. One future educator shared a powerful motivation shaped by lived experience: *“Growing up, I never had a teacher who fully recognized my needs. That experience shaped the kind of educator I want to become. I want to be the teacher who shows up for students, listens, and creates an environment where they feel valued and capable of success.”*

These stories represent more than aspirations—they reflect a generation of leaders, innovators, caregivers, and advocates who are committed to making a difference.

Because of you, our scholars are not limited by circumstance. They are equipped with opportunity, strengthened by support, and inspired to give back in ways that will impact countless others.

As you reflect on these voices, we invite you to continue supporting and uplifting our scholars—not only through your generosity, but also through your thoughts and encouragement. Their journeys are just beginning, and the ripple effect of your investment will be felt for years to come.

Wallace Lorenzo Leeper



1935-1978

LEAP Forward, Inc. honors the memory of one of the most outstanding counselors who served at Calvert High School in Calvert County, Maryland.

Wallace Lorenzo Leeper graduated from the Richmond, VA public schools and Virginia Union University (also in Richmond) with a Bachelor of Science degree in Education. He later received his Masters Degree in Guidance from Indiana State University. His teaching career started in Calvert County as a History and English Teacher at Brooks High School. He continued to work in the school system as a coach and guidance counselor at Calvert Senior High and the Calvert Vocational-Technical Center.

His greatest enjoyment in his work was being able to secure employment for students upon graduation and even for those who quit school for various reasons. He was particularly instrumental in helping students obtain entrance into college or other postgraduate schools.

Wallace Lorenzo Leeper was heavily involved with the Pax-Tenn program, which was a cooperative education program that provided minority students college funding and employment at the Patuxent Naval Air Station (now known as Naval Aviation Warfare Center) in Patuxent River, MD. More than 20 Calvert County students earned college engineering degrees and obtained engineering work positions through the Pax-Tenn program under Mr. Leeper's guidance.

A great number of people owe their successes in life to Wallace Lorenzo Leeper. He worked tirelessly to support students and provided an extremely personal touch to counseling. Truly a rare gift that is not prevalent in our school systems today. He really cared and it showed through his actions. What dedication! What sincerity!

Wallace Leeper is the inspiration behind our nonprofit, LEAP Forward, Inc. Surnamed in his honor. Wallace Lorenzo Leeper lived the motto "Each One - Reach One" and when he helped "one" to succeed, he looked for another.
